
Saturday Virtual walk 'Radical lives'

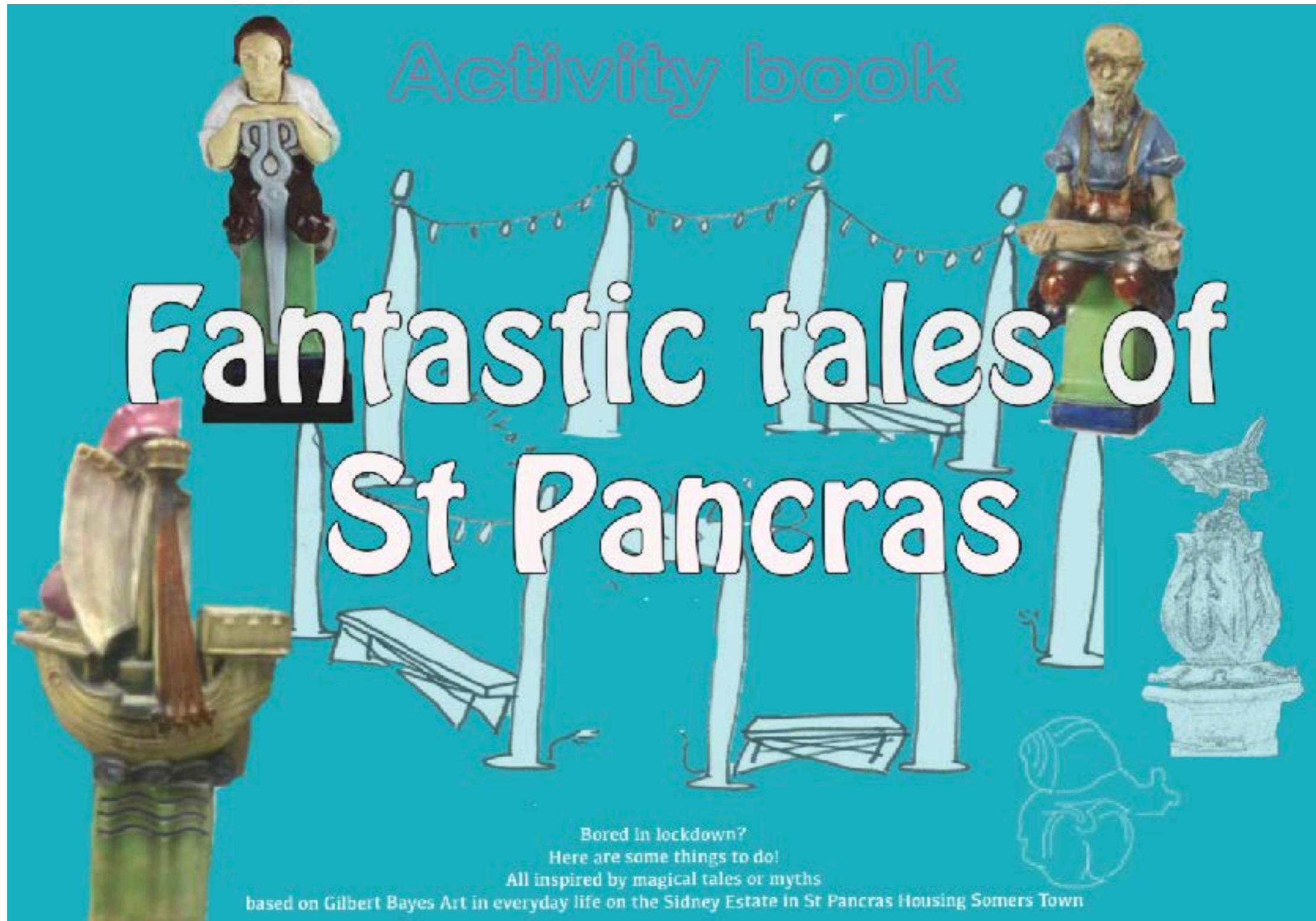

HILL HOUSING

IN SOMERS TOWN

Somers Town is fit.

Yet to its credit lies a remarkable group of housing which earned the favour of an Italian hill town. Designed by an architect from the 1918 Hungarian Revolution, later won by a Polish survivor of Auschwitz and finally completed by a leading Scottish architect, Oakbank Court is a striking example of the design created by Camden Architects' design team under Borough Architect Ianey Cook in the 1940s and '50s.

Other notable works include First Road and St Andrew's Road by Ivorase Brown and Jack Jacobs; Somers Hill (later SOMES), Mansfield Road/Lancet Street and Madon Lane by Sir Gordon Brown and Alan Francis; and Highgate near Tren Du Rosa Street.

These belong to a brief golden age when many architects fought for their kind of that nothing was too good for social housing, using modern materials to create light, fitted and exciting interior spaces in an era which was united by the pursuit of reform, the growing reaction against Modernism of the twenties and thirties.
