


# Cost of living briefing for schools

Tackling poverty



## What do we know?

- Crisis is hitting those already disproportionately impacted by poverty
- 4146 households in negative budgets and 9555 in fuel poverty.
- Approx 2,500 children in the Borough living in households at risk or already in financial crisis.
- Public health has identified specific cohorts who are more at risk
- Recent survey showed 24% were worried about money





## **Cost of Living Crisis Fund**

- £2m fund to provide support for those in severe financial hardship
- Up to 2 awards a year
- Payment into bank accounts, energy vouchers, clothes vouchers, electrical appliances, other household items
- Frontline staff, community partners and schools all signed up to be trusted referral partners
- Simple online form to refer someone





### What we've achieved so far









#### Household type


